Saturday 1st – Saturday 8th

- Sat.1st** During **International Stress Week**, we pray for all those who are feeling overwhelmed by stress, may they experience your peace and remember Jesus' invitation to 'come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.' (Matthew 11:28)
- Sun.2nd** On **All Saints Sunday** we give thanks for the faith of the saints who now dwell with you, help us to follow their example and serve you with our lives. We pray for all the saints on earth – your church – may we delight in them: 'As for the saints in the land, they are the excellent ones in whom is all my delight.' (Psalm 16:3)
- Mon.3rd** Lord God, we uphold before you all those who are **sick and infirm, the sad, lonely and those who are housebound**, especially those who are mentioned on our Weekly Prayer List. May they experience your presence, and so find strength and grace through Jesus Christ our Lord.
- Tue.4th** Loving Father, we uphold before you all our **local Medical Practices**. Bless doctors, nurses, receptionists and other ancillary staff as they continue your healing work on earth.
- Wed.5th** God of healing and compassion, we thank you for the **National Health Service**, and for the dedication of all who work in it. Give skill, sympathy and resilience to all who care for the sick, and your wisdom to those engaged in medical research.
- Thu.6th** **Pray for Suzanne who is leading our worship on Sunday at both the 9.30 and 11.30 Services for Remembrance.** Pray too for Jo, our Choir Leader, our choir and our organist. Holy Spirit, guide and inspire them, that through our worship those present may be brought ever closer to you.
- Fri.7th** Lord, we ask for your blessing on our **Church School, St. Michael's Middle**, for Darren Ayling, its Headteacher, children, staff and Academy Committee.
- Sat.8th** **On the feast day of the Saints and Martyrs of England**, we remember those who have gone before us and particularly those who gave their lives for the gospel. May we share their faith as we follow you Jesus, counting the cost of being your disciples.

- Sun.9th** On **Remembrance Sunday**, as communities come together to remember all those who have lost their lives as a result of war, we pray that your church would be a light to those who gather, reflecting your love, and pointing them to you and your way of peace.

- Tue.11th** On **Remembrance Day**, we pray: ***‘Ever-living God we remember those whom you have gathered from the storm of war into the peace of your presence; may that same peace calm our fears, bring justice to all peoples and establish harmony among the nations, through Jesus Christ our Lord.’***
- Wed.12th** **Pray for Suzanne and Alan Fryer who are leading our worship on Sunday.** Pray too for Jo, our Choir Leader, our choir and our organist. Holy Spirit, guide and inspire them, that through our worship those present may be brought ever closer to you.
- Thu.13th** On **World Kindness Day**, we remember the immeasurable grace and kindness God has shown us in all he has done for us. Help us to be kind to another: ‘as God’s chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with kindness...’ (Colossians 3:12)

Sunday 16th – Saturday 22nd

- Sun.16th** On **Safeguarding Sunday** we remember all victims of abuse and pray for healing. We give thanks for our parish safeguarding advisors, our diocesan safeguarding team and all who work to make our churches safe places. Help us to play our part, to have the bravery to speak up and look out for all those who are vulnerable.
- Mon.17th** On the **International Survivors of Suicide Loss Day**, we pray for all those who have lost loved ones to suicide. In times of pain and confusion, may they know you are near to the broken hearted, and that you yourself are acquainted with grief. Help us to listen well, and to weep with those who weep.

- Tue.18th** During **COP30**, now taking place (6th – 21st November) we pray for our world leaders, that you would give them ears to listen to those most affected by climate change, and wisdom on how to take action. We pray you would deepen our gratitude for all your hands have made and move our hearts to care more deeply for your creation and for each other.
- Wed.19th** **Pray for our Ministry Team who are leading the Cafe worship on Sunday.** Pray too for Jo, our Choir Leader, our choir and our organist. Holy Spirit, guide and inspire them, that through our worship those present may be brought ever closer to you.

- Fri.28th** God of compassion, we pray for **the homeless and all those who sleep outdoors at night.** We give thanks for those who devote their lives to supporting homeless people and who share the vision of a society without homelessness. We pray for the work of Crisis, the Salvation Army, Routes to Roots in Poole and other Charities committed to this cause.

- Sun.30th** On the **Feast Day of Andrew the Apostle,** one of the first called by Jesus, we remember how he left everything behind to follow you. Lord, help us to have that same devotion, and teach us to be 'fishers of people' like your disciple Andrew.
